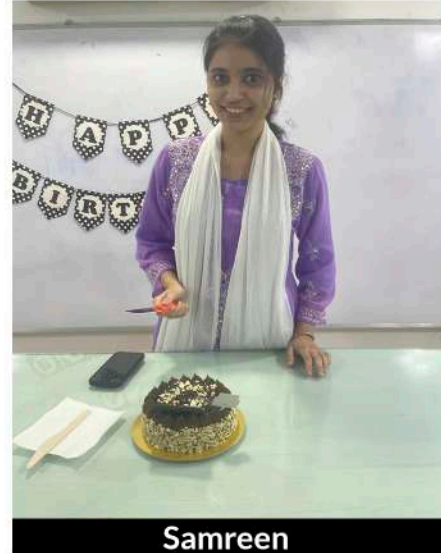

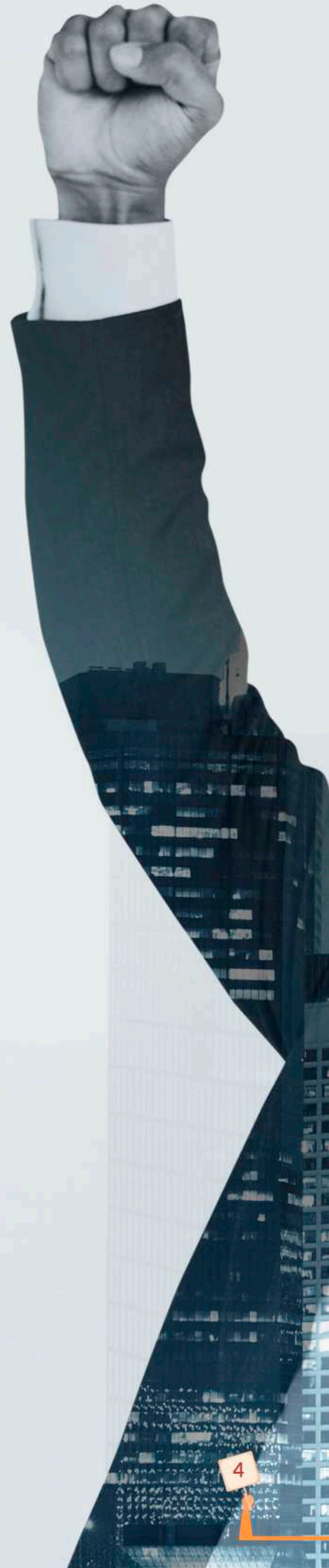

Bhangarh is situated in the **Alwar district of Rajasthan**, Bhangarh is an ancient town with a complex history dating back to the 17th century.



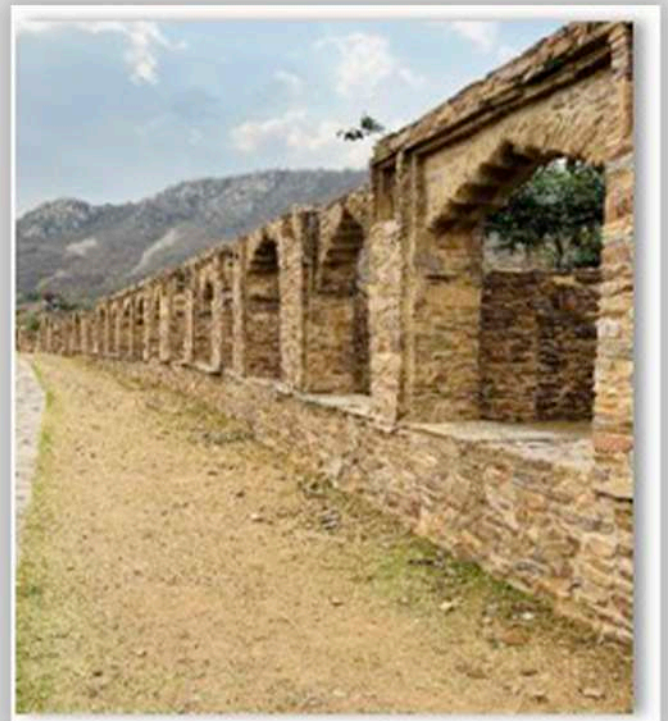

Even today, the gates of the Bhangarh are closed post 5PM and



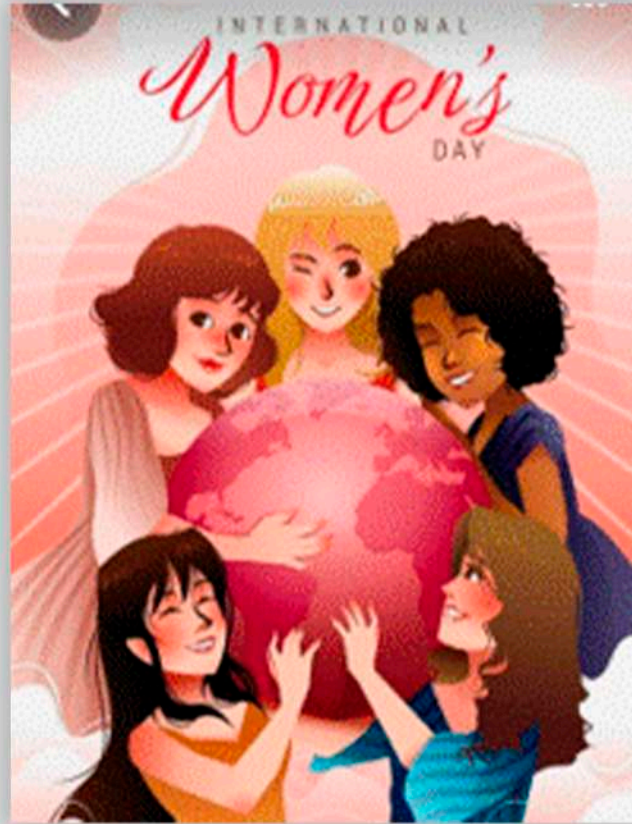
nobody is allowed to enter. As it is believed that there are some demonic activities happening inside various secluded rooms of the Fort especially on a No Moon night (Amavasya).

Let us renew our commitment to take bold action against gender inequality. educationists, we must empower girls and boys to challenge stereotypes that limit women's potential.

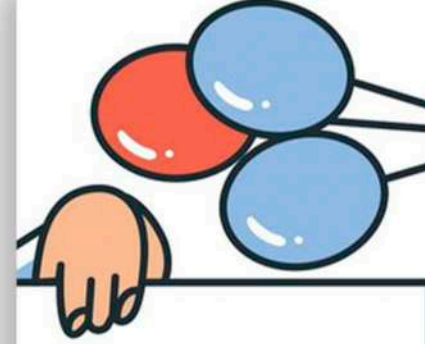
We must teach respect and safeguard our female students from harm. We must inspire girls to dream big, develop their talents and have the confidence to excel in any field.

When women are empowered, humanity moves forward. By promoting gender equality today, we can build a fairer, more just and peaceful world tomorrow. That is the promise of this important day.

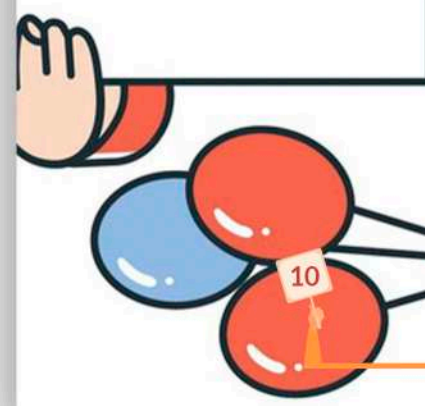
